## How to Join Our Parish

### 1. I am an active Catholic.

If you are moving to our community there is a simple step to becoming a member of our parish. By simply filling out the registration form you will become members of our parish. Forms may be found online at [stjudeparish.com](http://stjudeparish.com), at the information table in the narthex, parish office and the back of this guide. Being a member of our parish involves a few assumptions: first, that you will attend Mass every Sunday, become involved in our faith community, and that you will support the parish financially.

### 2. I am returning to the Catholic Church.

Welcome home. One of the interesting things about Catholics is that, even if they have not been to Mass in decades, they still regard themselves as Catholic and would describe themselves as having a Catholic outlook on life. Technically, the process of becoming active in the practice of your faith is quite simple, if there are no extenuating circumstances. It may only involve making your confession. Here, God reconciles us to himself and the Church. Confessing that one has chosen to be disobedient to the teachings and law of the Church is certainly an appropriate part of one's confession. If the absence from Mass has been for some other reason, one that affects your status in the Church, then much more might be required. If, for example, there is a failed marriage and subsequent second marriage, then a case might need to be presented to the Bishop's Tribunal. We have experts who are ready to help you with this process.

### 3. I am not Catholic (yet).

For those who are unbaptized or baptized in another faith community, the Catholic Church has devised an extensive process of education, spiritual preparation and formation. This is known as the RCIA, which stands for the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. (The word 'rite' refers to a ritual or ceremonial which, in this case, describes some of what occurs in the process.) The RCIA in our parish is predominantly presented by laity with strategic involvement of the clergy. Its goal is to give people a working knowledge of the Catholic Church and an adequate preparation to fully participate in the life of the parish community. The class typically meets once a week from mid-September until Easter. After this long period of preparation, those who are not baptized are baptized, and all are confirmed and admitted to Communion.

Those who have been baptized in another faith community are invited to use the RCIA process to find their way into the Catholic Church. While much of the material presented in the classes is intended for the unbaptized, those who were raised in a Protestant Church find these classes to be an appropriate means of preparation to become Catholic.

Those who are from the Orthodox Church who desire to become Catholic may do so in a much-reduced period of preparation. The Orthodox Church is regarded as having valid Holy Orders (validly ordained clergy) and, therefore, their sacraments are fully accepted in the Catholic Church.

## Safe Environment

As a parish family, we depend on each other to help us safeguard those entrusted to us by God. It says a great deal about you as an adult volunteer, that you are willing to do what is necessary to insure the safety of the most vulnerable members of our parish.

Mandated by the Diocese of Dallas, all volunteers (18 years and older) working with children, youth and vulnerable adults are cleared through the Diocesan Safe Environment Program. Each ministry followed by an \* requires a safe environment clearance to participate in an adult leadership role. To begin this process, go to [www.dallas.setanet.org](http://www.dallas.setanet.org). The requirements are as follows:

1. **Complete** the Diocesan Screening Form
2. **Attend** the initial Family of Faith video
3. **Complete** an annual recertification class
4. **Undergo** a background check every two years (automatic, if maintaining volunteer status)
5. **Provide** three references
6. **Interview** with the Safety Director
7. **Sign** the Acknowledgement Form confirming you have read the program guide and will abide by Diocesan rules

To view the Family of Faith video or to recertify annually, class schedules are posted on [www.dallas.setanet.org](http://www.dallas.setanet.org). Times, dates, and locations are noted. You may complete online training classes or attend a class in person. Classes offered at St. Jude are published in the bulletin and on our website.

## Children's Faith Formation

### Religious Education Programs \*

St. Jude provides a comprehensive catechetical program based on the Catechism of the Catholic Church, Scripture, Catholic teachings and traditions. Each grade level focuses on a specific theme. By the end of each year, students will have been exposed to, and understand a variety of topics within their grade level theme. All learning is cumulative and students are expected to be familiar with the previous year's curriculum.

The learning of our Catholic faith begins in the home at birth and continues for a life time. Children are expected to be enrolled in religious education classes through high school. The reception of the sacraments is the beginning, not the end, of their formation as Catholics. Enrollment begins in the spring for the following academic year. ## Stewardship Fundamentals

One of the biggest mistakes about any enterprise is to approach the task haphazardly. A building, an education, a trip - all require planning. So it is the case with the formation of our Christian Life.

*<sup>27</sup> Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. <sup>28</sup> Which of you wishing to construct a tower does not first sit down and calculate the cost to see if there is enough for its completion? <sup>29</sup> Otherwise, after laying the foundation and finding himself unable to finish the work the onlookers should laugh at him <sup>30</sup> and say, 'This one began to build but did not have the resources to finish.' <sup>31</sup> Or what king marching into battle would not first sit down and decide whether with ten thousand troops he can successfully oppose another king advancing upon him with twenty thousand troops? <sup>32</sup> But if not, while he is still far away, he will send a delegation to ask for peace terms. (Luke 14:27-32)*

Now, I think it would be helpful here to notice that Jesus' use of the metaphors of the tower and the size of an army are related to the cross, "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." Jesus is helping those who are listening to his teachings to make a clear and calculated decision about being a disciple.

The miracles of Jesus and his promise of care and protection make him an attractive leader, but his intention is to lead us to the holiness of self-sacrificial love represented in the cross. This is the cross we are to carry and, while it comes in many forms, our own willingness to give is undoubtedly at the center of what it means for us.

For many Christians, the first step in the stewardship journey is the recognition that it is a necessary part of our life and faith. We cannot imagine that we can eliminate this. Our substantial and faithful participation in giving to the church is essential to the church, but it is also essential to our peace of soul. We need always to be striving to do the right thing.

*<sup>41</sup> He sat down opposite the treasury and observed how the crowd put money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. <sup>42</sup> A poor widow also came and put in two small coins worth a few cents. <sup>43</sup> Calling his disciples to himself, he said to them, "Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. <sup>44</sup> For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood. (Mark 12:41-44)*

Jesus' praise of this widow establishes the holiness of our support of the church, but even more it demonstrates the depth of giving to which God calls us. The Old Testament standard of giving is the tithe, which is ten percent of one's income. The New Testament standard is this widow, the cross, the lives of the saints and martyrs. There is no limit to what God might call us to give.

To prepare us for whatever God might call us to give, we need to be regular and disciplined about our giving. Starting somewhere is important, and then by growing into our giving by adding a percentage point each year we will reach the goal of responsible giving. The satisfaction of knowing that we have been given the opportunity to share in the work of the church is an astonishing gift.

Even though we may never be aware in this life of the good God has accomplished through us, perhaps someday God will let us see the future fruit of our giving. Imagine a young person, a traveler, a single mom, a grief stricken grandfather sitting alone in the church. They feel the weight of the sorrow of the cross bearing down on them. Then, as they look at the beauty and peace that surrounds them, they sense the presence of God. The prayers of those that have gone before them are holding them up, making their burden a little lighter.

The gift someone shared has made it possible for them to kneel in this church, and to know that God loves them, no matter how hard life has become. Perhaps this is the fruit of your gift.
